2011 "The Neo-Classical Objective" Pinot Noir

The Vineyards

The Neo-Classical Objective has three parts:

- 1. Historical Orientation 100% whole cluster fermentation
- 2. Classic Varietal Character (Typicity) vineyard location and ideal growing temperatures
- 3. Enriched Technique targeting the source of tannins for an improved condition of ageability

Only vineyards that meet this objective for a given vintage are considered for this blend.

White Rose Vineyard was planted from 1978-1981 in the Dundee Hills. The soil is volcanic Jory and the vines span a east-southeast slope at 700-850' elevation. The vineyard is entirely self-rooted Pommard Pinot noir. Yields were approximately 1.0 TPA in 2011 and fruit was harvest November 5th.

Vista Hills Vineyard is located immediately north of White Rose Vineyard along an east facing slope of volcanic Jory soil. The vines were planted from 1999-2001 with Dijon 115 & 777 clones. Yields averaged 2.0 TPA in 2011 and the fruit was harvested on November 2^{nd} and 6^{th} .

Murto Vineyard is also located in the Dundee Hills sub-AVA and was planted on volcanic Jory soils from 1988-2005. The clones include Pommard, Wadensville and Dijon 115 at an elevations of 700-800'. Yields averaged 1.5 TPA across the various blocks of this vineyard.

In The Winery

All vineyards were sorted and fermented with 100% whole clusters. Total skin contact ranged from 23-25 days. All vineyards were basket pressed in our traditional wooden ratchet presses. All lots were racked once after the completion of malo-lactic fermentation. 9% new French oak was used in the blend and the wine was bottled after 16 months in barrel.
